

## Directions to the Godwin Cottage from Ottawa

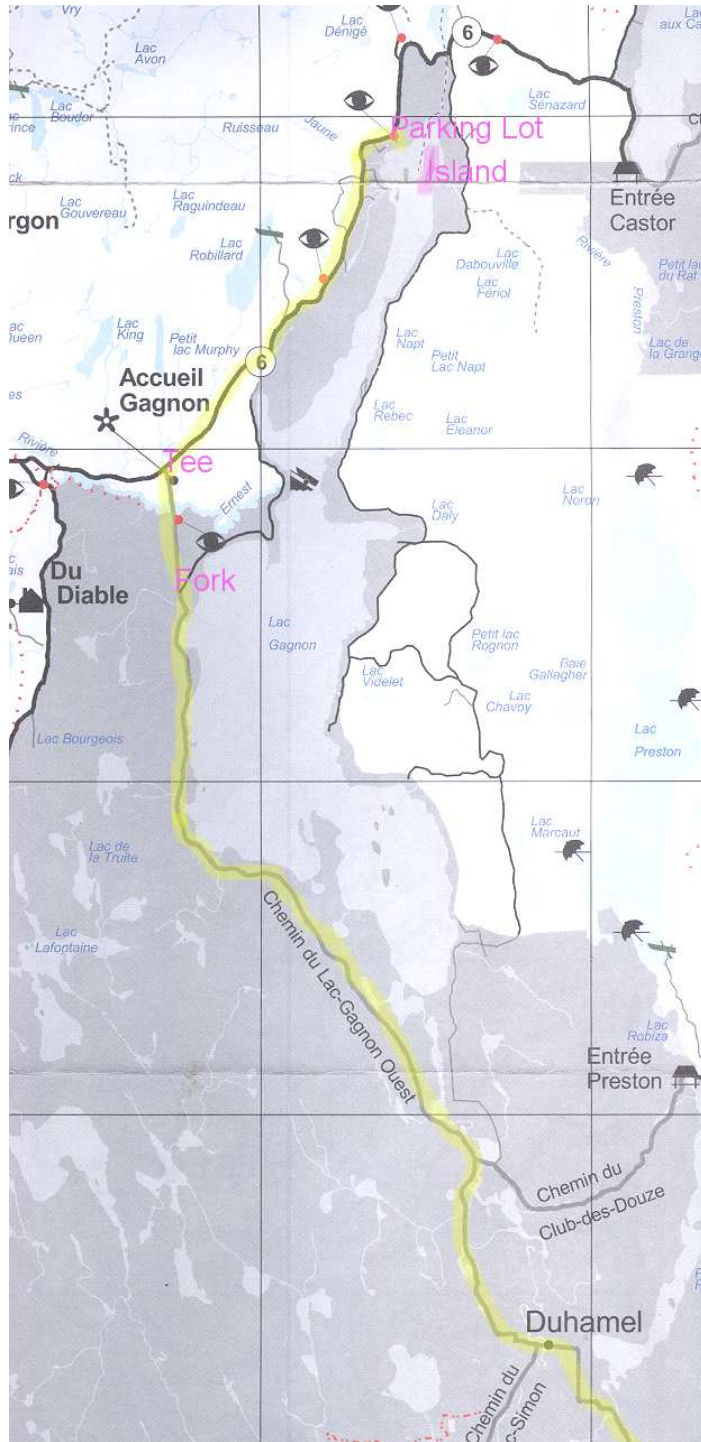
These instructions start with you proceeding east on Québec autoroute 50. The easiest way to do that is to take King Edward out of Ottawa, across the bridge to Québec and then follow the exit to Montréal. There are other routes. If you take the Cumberland ferry to Masson you will arrive at route 148 est at Masson (instruction 2)

1. Take Québec Route 50 est (East) from the Ontario/Québec border. **Watch for speed traps.** [Use map 1](#)
2. Proceed to exit 166 at Masson and follow route 148 est to Thurso (next town, it has a paper mill).
3. Turn left (North) at traffic light in Thurso onto route 317 nord
4. Pass by Sainte Sixte (half way point)
5. Turn right at a tee intersection in Ripon. Follow 317 nord.
6. Proceed 650 meters to what looks like a sharp right turn. **Don't turn**; go straight ahead over the crest and down a steep hill. Follow 317 nord.
7. Proceed 6.4 km to another tee. Turn left onto route 321 nord.
8. Proceed through Cheneville (Oakville) and remain on route 321.
9. You will arrive in Duhamel 25.7 km after step 7.

10. Turn right at tee in Duhamel and you will pass a church. Keep going.
11. After you start driving beside the lake (on your right hand side) you will finally reach dirt road. Keep going.
12. You will reach a fork intersection. ([labeled Fork on map](#)) Do not take the right turn. Go straight. [Look at picture 1.](#)
13. In 1.9 km you will reach a tee (marked Tee) on map. You will have crossed a wooded bridge and passed a park reception centre. (Accueil Gagnon).
14. Turn right onto route 6.
15. Proceed 6.55 km. You will see a sign on right of road labeled "LeMoine".
16. Turn down this little road. You are here!
17. If the chain is across the road, you can easily unhook it. Rehook it after you pass.

### Notes:

- If you cross another wooden bridge beside a lake, and just before a steep hill, you have gone too far. Turn around.
- Our cell number at the cottage is +1 (819) 278-5564
- When you arrive at the lake you are facing south and our cottage is to the east (left) almost out of sight. The radio is usually behind a concrete "log" in the trees by the sand beach (to the right, west of the dock) in a plastic bag.
- how to use the radio: ([See Radio diagram](#))
  - a. Remove from bag
  - b. Press small white button at top to turn the unit on
  - c. Press black triangle above speaker grill marked "Press to talk" and say something
  - d. Let go of the Press to talk button so you can listen
  - e. We will acknowledge and come and get you.

**Basic Operation of Your Radio**

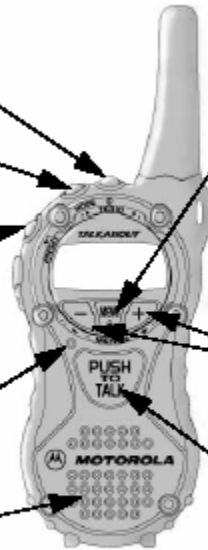
**Use  to --**  
 • Turn power on/off


**Use  to --**  
 • Scroll through mode selections  
 • Return to two-way mode (when held down)



**Use  to --**  
 • Transmit call tone  
 • Start and stop stopwatch  
 • Select and scroll through stereo presets (T6310 only)


**Microphone**

**Speaker**



**Use  to --**  
 • Scroll through menus  
 • Lock the keypad (when held down and not in a menu)  
 • Exit the menu (when held down while in a menu)

**Use  and  to --**  
 • Change the volume  
 • Scroll through and select settings

**Use  to --**  
 • Talk on the radio  
 • Save a setting
